

CALIFORNIA UNINSURED MOTORIST SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION

California Law requires an insurer to provide uninsured motorist coverage in each bodily injury liability insurance policy it issues covering liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle. An insured may, by agreement in writing, delete uninsured motorists coverage entirely, select limits lower than the liability limits of the policy, or delete the coverage when a motor vehicle is operated by a designated natural person.

Please check the boxes which apply to the coverage you wish to select.

I select uninsured/underinsured motorists coverage at the same limits as the bodily injury liability limits of the policy.

I select uninsured/underinsured motorists coverage at the financial responsibility limits of this state.

The California Insurance Code requires an insurer to provide uninsured motorists coverage in each bodily injury liability insurance policy it issues covering liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle. Those provisions also permit the insurer and the applicant to agree to delete the coverage completely or to delete the coverage when a motor vehicle is operated by a natural person or persons designated by name. Uninsured motorists coverage insures the insured, his or her heirs, or legal representatives for all sums within the limits established by law, which the person or persons are legally entitled to recover as damages for bodily injury, including any resulting sickness, disease, or death, to the insured from the owner or operator of an uninsured motor vehicle not owned or operated by the insured or a resident of the same household. An uninsured motor vehicle includes an underinsured motor vehicle as defined in subdivision (p) of Section 11580.2 of the Insurance Code.

An insured may delete the coverage completely or delete the coverage when a motor vehicle is operated by a natural designated person.

The California Insurance Code requires an insurer to provide uninsured motorists coverage in each bodily injury liability insurance policy it issues covering liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle. Those provisions also permit the insurer and the applicant to agree to provide the coverage in an amount less than that required by subdivision (m) of Section 11580.2 of the Insurance Code but not less than the financial responsibility requirements. Uninsured motorists coverage insures the insured, his or her heirs, or legal representatives for all sums within the limits established by the law, which the person or persons are legally entitled to recover as damages for bodily injury, including any resulting sickness, disease, or death, to the insured from the owner or operator of an uninsured motor vehicle not owned or operated by the insured or a resident of the same household. An uninsured motor vehicle includes an underinsured motor vehicle as defined in subdivision (p) or Section 11580.2 of the Insurance Code.

I reject uninsured/underinsured motorists bodily injury and property damage coverage entirely.

When a motor vehicle is operated by the natural person(s) designated below, uninsured/underinsured motorists bodily injury and property damage coverage is excluded.

California Law requires insurers to offer coverage for damage to the insured motor vehicle, to the extent that you are legally entitled to recover from the owner or operator of the uninsured motor vehicle, caused by an uninsured motor vehicle, that either:

- (1) Pays the collision deductible on the insured motor vehicle when you have purchased collision coverage.
- (2) Pays for the damage to the insured motor vehicle when you have not purchased collision coverage.

Payment shall not include damage to personal property or loss of use of a motor vehicle and shall not exceed the smaller of the actual cash value of the insured motor vehicle, or \$3,500.

You may reject such coverage completely or reject such coverage when an insured motor vehicle is operated by a natural person designated by name.

I reject this coverage entirely.

When a motor vehicle is operated by the natural person(s) designated below, the coverage is excluded.

If you decide to arbitrate, you must formally begin arbitration proceedings by notifying us in writing, sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.

Any person who knowingly makes an application for motor vehicle insurance coverage containing any statement that the applicant resides or is domiciled in this state when, in fact, that applicant resides or is domiciled in a state other than this state, is subject to criminal and civil penalties.
